


Eastern Europe through Mrs. Swan's firsthand experiences in Croatia, Hungary, and Slovenia.



Mrs. Swan was one of two Kokomo Schools teachers to receive a Kokomo Public Schools Education Foundation grant to cover a portion of the cost to attend International Baccalaureate (IB) Immersion Training in these three Eastern European countries.

"The immersion experience was amazing," Mrs. Swan noted. "I learned so much about that part of the world." These immersion trips expose Kokomo's IB teachers to different cultures from

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Mrs. Swan developed her first idea for a lesson during her first day in Croatia. While in Vis, Croatia, the Kokomo teachers met a man whose family has been farming the same plot of land for 500 years – making him an 18<sup>th</sup> generation farmer. The 85-year-old grows grapes, cabbage, figs, pomegranates, cherries, potatoes, and lavender. The teachers had the opportunity to tour his farm, ask

him questions, and enjoy a meal in his family's restaurant. Mrs. Swan's Environmental Science students already learn about agricultural practices in the U.S., so the lessons she learned from an 85-year-old farmer in Eastern Europe about ancient farming practices will be a welcome addition to their classroom discussions.

Mrs. Swan took photos of a giant solar panel she saw on a pier on the Adriatic Sea. It was a piece of art, but also a solar panel, she noted. The Advanced Placement (AP) and IB teacher also took many photos while visiting Plitvice Lakes National Park, with its 92 waterfalls. Mrs. Swan plans to use those photos in her lessons throughout the school year.






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
