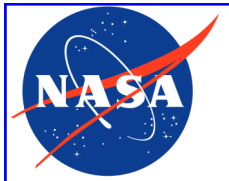

Win 10 Tip:

How to Change the Size of Your Icons

If you want your desktop icons in Windows 10 to be larger so you don't have to squint to see them or make it easier to tap on a touchscreen, you may want to change the size of your icons. Perhaps you'd prefer that they were smaller so the shortcuts didn't take up as much space on your screen?

To change the size of your desktop icons:

- ◆ Right-click on an empty space on your desktop.
- ◆ Select View from the menu.
- ◆ Select either Large Icons, Medium Icons, or Small Icons. The default is medium icons.
