Steps to Protect Online Security

- Create strong passwords. Use a mixture of upper and lowercase letters, numbers and symbols. Do not use the same password for more than one website. Change passwords every few months.
- Rethink your answers to security questions. Between various forms of social media, there is a lot of information you have supplied to social media. Answer security questions with something other than what your answer should be.
- Opt for double verification when available. To access information on any device for the first time, many sites will do this.
- Protect your Wi-Fi with a password.
- Don't click on unfamiliar links. If something looks suspicious, delete it.
